DRAEGER, INC. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE (SAFETY)

1. GENERAL. These terms and conditions are integral to the agreement governing the sale and purchase of goods ("Goods") and service ("Service") between the seller, Draeger, Inc. ("Draeger"), and the purchaser ("Customer"). Goods and Service are referred to herein collectively as "Product." The agreement governing this sale and purchase of Product ("Agreement") consists of the following, all of which are hereby incorporated herein by reference: (i) these terms and conditions, (ii) the written sale or service agreement, if any, signed by Draeger and Customer (referred to herein singularly as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties"), including schedules thereto, that is in effect on the date the applicable Purchase Order ("PO") is delivered to Draeger, and any amendments thereto ("Contract Document"), (iii) any price quote ("Quote"), and (iv) any PO submitted by Customer with respect to a Quote; provided, however, Draeger shall not be bound by any terms, conditions, or other provisions in a PO that are different from, in addition to, or inconsistent with, the other provisions of this Agreement.

2. PRICES.

(a) Prices are as stated in the Contract Document. If no Contract Document is in effect at the time the order is filled, the prices shall be as stated on the applicable Quote; provided, that such Quote is valid at that time. In all other cases, prices are those currently in effect on Draeger's standard price list at time of shipment. Unless otherwise stated in writing by Draeger, prices include the cost of standard domestic packing. Prices exclude charges for freight, unloading, storage, insurance, taxes, excises, fees, duties, or other charges related to Product. Customer shall bear the cost of all applicable sales, use, property, excise, and manufacturer's taxes and any duties, license, or similar fees, which may be imposed upon the sale, use, or performance of the Product.

(b) If this Agreement is for multiple years, then the prices set forth herein are fixed only for the first 12 months hereof. Thereafter, Draeger may adjust the prices ("Price Adjustment"), pursuant to a proposed Price Adjustment notice ("Price Adjustment Notice"). Draeger shall provide the Price Adjustment Notice to Customer, in writing, specifying the adjustment, no less than 90 days in advance of a proposed Price Adjustment ("Price Adjustment Notice Period"). If Customer objects to the proposed Price Adjustment during the Price Adjustment Notice Period, then, notwithstanding anything else in this Agreement to the contrary, Draeger may cancel this Agreement with 60 days' notice without penalty ("Price Termination Notice"). During the 60-day Price Termination Notice period, Customer may continue to purchase Products at the then-current price. If Customer does not object to the proposed Price Adjustment, then such proposed Price Adjustment shall go into effect on the date stated in the proposed Price Adjustment Notice and shall be incorporated herein by reference. Draeger shall fill all POs received prior to the effective date of the Price Adjustment or, if earlier, the termination of this Agreement, at the then-current prices. Unless otherwise agreed to by Draeger and Customer, all other terms, conditions, and provisions of this Agreement shall continue unchanged and remain in full force and effect after any such Price Adjustment. A Price Adjustment does not obligate any of the Parties to agree to any other modification of this Agreement.

3. PAYMENT TERMS.

(a) Unless otherwise agreed in writing, Customer shall make payment in full without any set-off (for any reason) no later than 30 days from the date of invoice in United States Dollars ("USD"). Partial shipments of Goods shall be invoiced as shipped. Draeger reserves the right to require (i) payment in advance, (ii) cash on delivery, or (iii) a modification of credit terms.

(b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, payment on advance orders paid by credit card shall be charged and paid for at that time of the order. All payments made with personal credit cards may include an administrative fee of up to 2.8% of the value on the invoice. Payments made through corporate purchasing credit cards may include an administrative fee of up to 2.5% of the value on the invoice.

(c) Draeger reserves the right in the event of late payment: (i) to suspend all deliveries or Service or to cancel any of its outstanding obligations under this Agreement, or (ii) to charge interest on the late payment calculated on a day-to-day basis until the actual date of payment at the lower of (A) an annual rate of 12% or (B) the maximum rate allowed by law. Such remedies are in addition to any other rights or remedies available to Draeger under the law.

(d) If Customer pays less than the full amount due, the payment will be applied toward the outstanding balance. Draeger's acceptance of part of the amount due shall not interfere with Draeger's right to recover the balance of the amount due or right to pursue any other right or remedy under the law.

(e) All POs are subject to credit approval by Draeger.

4. DELIVERY, INSTALLATION, RISK, AND TITLE.

(a) Title to, and risk of loss for, the Goods shall pass to Customer upon delivery as determined on the basis of FCA (INCOTERMS 2020) prepay and add all related transportation and insurance costs as a separate line item to the invoice to Customer unless Customer provides their own transportation provider and/or account number in which case the delivery is determined on the basis of EXW (INCOTERMS 2020). Upon passage of title of the Goods from Draeger to Customer or, if earlier, the date as of which Draeger makes a commercially reasonable attempt to deliver Goods, Customer shall be responsible and liable for, and agrees to defend and indemnify Draeger against, all claims, injuries, losses fines, penalties, damages, or costs resulting from Customer's storage, handling, disposal, release, use, or resale of the Goods or their containers.

(b) Delivery, installation, and completion dates are only approximate and Draeger will not be liable for failure to meet such dates. Notwithstanding the foregoing,

Draeger shall use reasonable efforts to meet quoted delivery, installation, and completion dates. Partial shipments may be made at Draeger's sole discretion or, with Draeger's consent, at Customer's request.

(c) Unless stated otherwise in writing by Draeger, freight and transportation costs, including standard ground transportation, packing, custom duties, and other similar charges, shall be borne as follows: (i) for PO orders equal to or less than \$15,000, Customer shall bear all such costs, (ii) for PO orders greater than \$15,000, Draeger shall bear all such costs. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event Customer requests an expedited order, Customer shall bear the additional costs.

(d) Customer shall use commercially reasonable efforts to allow for timely delivery of Goods, including, without limitation, providing instructions, granting access during Customer's business hours (or such other time agreed by the Parties), and obtaining any required licenses or permits.

(e) Installation costs, if applicable, are included in the price of Goods, unless indicated as a separate Service on the Contract Document or Quote.

Customer is responsible for ensuring that the installation site is fully prepared prior to installation and for bearing all costs necessary to prepare site for installation in accordance with Draeger's instructions, including, without limitation, (i) engaging in any required labor, (ii) acquiring any required materials, (iii) to the extent applicable, ensuring that the Customer's network (A) meets any Draeger specific requirements, and (B) is fully functioning as mandated by all manuals and other instructions requested of Customer by Draeger, and (iv) ensuring compliance with all governmental requirements, including without limitation, all certifications and approvals for installation and operation. Customer shall provide to Draeger or its subcontractor, as applicable, access to the installation site and, if required, safe and secure space on site for storage of Goods and equipment prior to and during installation.

5. ACCEPTANCE. Customer shall inspect Goods received and notify Draeger of any Nonconforming Goods prior to acceptance. Goods shall be deemed to be accepted by Customer 15 days from date of delivery; provided, however, that (i) if earlier, acceptance shall occur immediately on the first day Customer uses Product, or (ii) with respect to Goods requiring installation (other than connection to Customer network), acceptance shall occur on the earlier of 5 days after installation or 30 days after delivery. Installation shall be deemed to be completed upon final verification under Draeger's standard procedures that Goods meet all applicable written performance obligations. For this purpose, "Nonconforming Goods" means (i) Goods that are different from those identified on the PO confirmation or (ii) Goods with label or packaging that incorrectly identifies contents. Draeger shall, at its sole discretion, replace Nonconforming Goods with conforming Goods or credit or refund the price of Nonconforming Goods. Such remedy is the exclusive remedy for Nonconforming Goods. Draeger shall bear the shipping costs related to return and replacement of Nonconforming Goods.

6. CHANGES AND RETURNS.

(a) POs may not be changed or canceled after PO is accepted by Draeger.

(b) Draeger reserves the right, subject to written notice, to substitute Goods or change specifications of Goods, which, in Draeger's judgment, does not materially affect the installation, performance, function, or price thereof. Goods may only be returned with prior authorization from Draeger. Eligible returns must follow the Customer Material Return Process in effect at the time of return as specified at <https://www.draeger.com/Library/Content/RMA-Process-Safety-2023.pdf> and which is hereby incorporated herein by reference ("RMA Process"). Unless warranty applies or in the case of a Nonconforming Good, restocking fees of up to 25% may apply.

7. DELAY OR FAILURE TO PERFORM OBLIGATIONS.

(a) Draeger shall not be deemed to be in breach or otherwise liable for any delay or failure in performance of any of its obligations under this Agreement caused, in whole or in part, by any act or omission of Customer or its agents, subcontractors, or employees.

(b) Neither Party shall be liable for failure to perform obligations (except for payment obligations) under this Agreement to the extent that such failure arises out of events beyond its reasonable control including, but not limited to, acts of government or compliance with any governmental laws, rules or regulations, acts of God, war, terrorist threats or acts, civil disturbance, fire, or other casualty, pandemic, strike, labor dispute, or unavailability of labor, carriers, raw materials, power, or supplies. Any delivery date may be extended, at Draeger's option, to the extent of any delay resulting from any such event.

8. WARRANTY.

(a) *Goods.* Draeger warrants that under normal use and with prescribed maintenance, storage, and care, Goods are free from defects in material and workmanship for the warranty period. Except as provided in a separate warranty statement in Goods manual or otherwise provided with Goods, the warranty period for new capital equipment is 12 months from date of delivery and disposable and consumable Goods (excluding sensors) are warranted at time of delivery only. All other Goods are warranted for 90 days from (i) date of delivery or (ii) in the case of software, date of implementation sign-off, or first productive use. Warranty is conditioned on (i) Customer providing immediate written notice of warranty-related claim to Draeger and following RMA Process, (ii) no repairs, modifications, or alterations being made to Goods other than by Draeger or its authorized representatives, (iii) Customer handling, using, storing, installing, operating, cleaning, and maintaining Goods in compliance with the instructions and specifications provided with Goods or incorporated into this Agreement, (iv) use of Goods only for the use intended by Draeger, (v) defect not related to the attachment of Goods to non-Draeger

supplied equipment or to Customer's network issues, (vi) Customer having fulfilled its payment obligations for Goods, and (vii) an inspection by Draeger that reveals that Customer's claim is valid under the terms of the warranty. Customer's remedy for a breach of this warranty is limited to repair, replacement, credit, or refund, at the sole option of Draeger. Repair or replacement may be with parts or product that are new, used, or refurbished. Repairs or replacements shall not interrupt, extend, or prolong the warranty period.

(b) *Service.* Draeger warrants that the Service shall be performed in a professional manner in accordance with generally recognized industry standards for similar service. Claims for breach of this Service warranty must be submitted to Draeger in writing within 90 days of the completion of Service. Customer's remedy for breach of Service warranty is limited to reperformance, credit, or refund, at the sole option of Draeger.

(c) *Third-Party Product.* If this Agreement includes the sale of third-party product not manufactured by Draeger or any of its affiliates, such products are provided to Customer solely at the direction of Customer with no recommendation by Draeger. Draeger makes no warranty for any third-party product. Customer's sole warranty for any third-party product, if any, is the original manufacturer's warranty, which Draeger agrees to pass on to Customer, as applicable. The obligation of Customer to pay Draeger for the third-party product is absolute and unconditional, and Customer waives and releases Draeger from all claims, damages, and losses arising out of such third-party product regardless of any claims Customer may have regarding such third-party product.

(d) *No Other Warranties.* **THE WARRANTIES IN THIS SECTION 9 ARE THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE WARRANTIES MADE WITH RESPECT TO PRODUCT. DRAEGER MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR PARTICULAR PURPOSE, TITLE, THIRD-PARTY NONINFRINGEMENT, COURSE OF DEALING, AND USAGE OF TRADE. DRAEGER DOES NOT WARRANT OR GUARANTEE THAT ANY PRODUCT WILL BE SECURE FROM CYBER THREATS, HACKING, OR SIMILARLY MALICIOUS ACTIVITY. DRAEGER DOES NOT WARRANT ANY CUSTOMER OR THIRD-PARTY PROVIDED NETWORK OR THE PERFORMANCE OF PRODUCT AS IMPACTED BY SUCH NETWORK CONNECTION.**

9. SERVICE BRIDGE SOLUTION. If Customer's use of Goods purchased is likely to be interrupted or delayed for an extended period due to the need to service the Goods, delay in delivery, or recall, upon Customer's request, Draeger may, to the extent available, temporarily place reasonably comparable equipment with Customer for its use until such time as the affected Goods are returned, repaired, or delivered, as applicable. Such placement is part of Draeger's warranty, contracted Service, or recall obligations, as applicable, and provided at no additional charge to Customer. Customer's option for such temporary use of equipment shall mitigate any damages or losses, if any, that would otherwise be incurred by Customer for such period.

10. INDEMNITY. To the extent permitted under applicable law, Draeger and Customer (each as "Indemnitor") shall indemnify the other Party and its affiliates (collectively "Indemnitee") from and against all third-party claims alleging bodily injury, death, or damage to the third-party's tangible property, but only to the extent caused by the Indemnitor's negligence or willful misconduct. No part of Customer's sites is considered third-party property for purposes of this indemnity. Indemnitee shall provide Indemnitor with prompt written notice of any third-party claims covered by this Section 10. Indemnitor has the unrestricted right to select and hire counsel and the exclusive right to conduct the legal defense or settle the claim on the Indemnitee's behalf; subject to Indemnitee's consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Indemnitor shall not make any admissions that might be prejudicial to the Indemnitee.

11. INSURANCE. If during the term of this Agreement Draeger may need access to Customer's premises to perform Service or for other reasons, Customer shall, at its own expense, maintain and carry insurance in full force and effect which includes, but is not limited to, commercial general liability in a sum no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$5,000,000 in the aggregate with financially sound and reputable insurers. Upon Draeger's request, Customer shall provide Draeger with a certificate of insurance from Customer's insurer evidencing the insurance coverage specified in this Agreement and which names Draeger as an additional insured. Customer shall provide Draeger with 30 days advance written notice in the event of a cancellation or material change in Customer's insurance policy. Except where prohibited by law, Customer shall require its insurer to waive all rights of subrogation against Draeger's insurers and Draeger.

12. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. IN NO EVENT SHALL ANY PARTY BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY OR THEIR AFFILIATES, WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), STRICT LIABILITY, INDEMNITY, OR ANY OTHER LEGAL THEORY, FOR LOST PROFITS OR LOST STORED, TRANSMITTED, OR RECORDED DATA, OR FOR ANY SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, PUNITIVE, OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES, EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY STATED IN THIS AGREEMENT, WITH RESPECT TO ANY MATTERS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE OTHER PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF THE SAME. DRAEGER'S MAXIMUM LIABILITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT IS THE ACTUAL PURCHASE PRICE RECEIVED BY DRAEGER FOR THE PRODUCT THAT GIVES RISE TO THE CLAIM.

13. PATENT, TRADEMARK, AND OTHER INFRINGEMENT CLAIMS. In the event of any claim, suit, or proceeding brought against Customer alleging any Draeger manufactured Good violates any patent, trademark, or copyright about which Customer notifies Draeger in writing within 5 days after Customer becomes aware of the allegation, Draeger shall, at its option and expense, (i) defend such claim, suit, or proceeding, (ii) procure the Customer's right to use the Good, (iii) remove or modify the Good to avoid infringement, or (iv) allow Customer to return the Good and refund the purchase price paid to Customer less reasonable depreciation for Customer's use of the Good. In the event of defense of such claim, suit, or proceeding, Customer shall give Draeger information, assistance, and exclusive authority to fully control the defense and settlement of such claim, suit or proceeding. This indemnity shall not apply if Customer modifies or combines, operates, or uses the Good with any product, data, software, apparatus, or program not provided by Draeger and Customer shall indemnify and hold Draeger harmless against any liability or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by Draeger in connection therewith.

14. RIGHTS IN SOFTWARE, DOCUMENTATION, AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY. To the extent software, data, or other documentation or information (collectively, "Software") is embedded in or delivered with any Goods sold under this Agreement, the sale of such Goods shall not constitute the transfer of the ownership rights in such Software. The Software shall remain Draeger's property and Draeger grants to Customer a non-exclusive, non-transferable license solely to use the Software for the purpose, and in the manner, for which the Software was designed and produced. Customer shall not modify, reverse engineer, or create derivative works based on any of the Software, or permit any third party to do so. In addition, to the extent any third-party software is included in the Software, Customer will comply with any third-party software license terms provided by Draeger to Customer. Software that is provided separately to Customer as a Product is not included under this Section 14, but is governed under a separate license agreement, and may be subject to a licensing fee.

15. DATA PROTECTION. The Parties agree to comply with any privacy and data protection laws, including without limitation the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), to the extent relevant to the exchange of data between the Parties or storage or exchange of data in connection with Product provided hereunder.

16. TERMINATION.  Augusta County Fire & Rescue is seeking financial assistance to acquire multiple fire related training aids for the enhancement of our volunteer and career members. This funding will be utilized for the purchase of forcible entry doors, vertical ventilation simulator, impalement/crush training scenarios, tools, and the mobility of all listed equipment to be delivered to our 15 stations throughout our county. Augusta County encompasses over 970 square miles with 141 career and 615 volunteer partners providing fire and EMS services to our citizens. With Augusta County being a very large geographical county, it is extremely hard for volunteer departments and career members to utilize the training center on a regular basis. This funding will support the ability to deliver modern and realistic training equipment to any station and allow all members to continue required ISO and job-related training requirements. Augusta County currently carries a large ATL carry forward balance due to an amendment change decades prior allowing all Augusta County volunteer agencies to have access to an interest accruing fund for apparatus purchasing on a revolving basis and annual turnout gear replacement. Current policies and addendums only allow ATL funds to be utilized for volunteer apparatus and turnout gear purchasing and does not have the availability for the purchase of any additional needs.

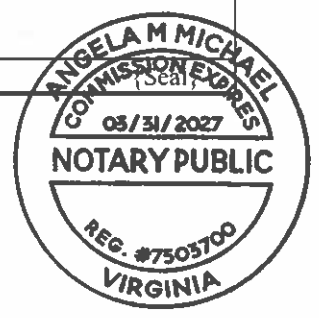

King and Queen County has applied for the FY2025 Virginia Regional Fire Service Training Facility (VRFSTF) Grant and wishes to be considered for a higher reimbursement percentage (80/20) based on need. King and Queen County is a small rural county located on Virginia's Middle Peninsula. With a population of approximately 6,700, it is the 7th smallest county in the Commonwealth and the 5th smallest in population density at 21.26 residents per square mile. And while being sparsely populated, King and Queen is Virginia's longest county at 72 miles in length, a truth which creates unique challenges in both funding and in providing effective fire protection services.

Fire protection is provided by the County's four volunteer fire departments, namely Upper King and Queen, Walkerton, Central King and Queen, and Lower King and Queen. Each department receives an annual allotment of \$32,000 from total projected FY2025 local revenue of \$16,298,672. Additional firefighting and training support is provided by the King and Queen County Department of Emergency Services using cross trained EMS providers. The County has no dedicated firefighter positions, and the Emergency Services Chief and Deputy Chief are funded as part-time positions.

King and Queen County receives \$30,000 annually in VDFP Aid to Localities (ATL) funding and utilizes this appropriation for major expenditures benefiting all volunteer departments. Currently, a county-wide rural water supply program has been identified as a major need and is in the final funding stage. This project is expected to consume the majority of current carry-over funds and our most recent annual appropriation.

King and Queen County works diligently to provide the best possible fire protection to our citizens. However, the majority of County funding is absorbed for primary operational expenses, such as fire apparatus, firefighting tools/equipment, personal protective equipment, buildings, insurance, and fuel. Yet, a major component that cannot be overlooked is training. The County would be extremely appreciative of any increase in grant funding that could be provided, and we will ensure that it is fully utilized to provide enhanced and increased training to all members of our County fire and rescue system.

Financial Need: Please provide a description of your locality's funding need.
 King and Queen and Middlesex are small rural counties located on the Middle Peninsula of Virginia. King and Queen County, the lead jurisdiction, is 315 square miles with a population of 6,608. It is one of the smallest populated counties in the state and does not possess a tax rate or tax base to adequately support fire department operations. Middlesex County, the secondary jurisdiction, is 130 square miles with a population of 10,625. It is one of the smallest-sized counties in the state and also constrained by tax income. Thus, both counties lack the ability to provide sufficient funding for training expenses, as the majority of directed money is allocated for operational expenses, such as: fire apparatus, tools and equipment, and PPE. As an example of need, in 2023, the Fire Services Board determined that King and Queen and Middlesex counties were sufficiently in need and changed their requested 50/50 split to an 80/20 split. Although this grant is requested as a 50/50 split, we would request a split of 80/20, if funding is available, and need is again recognized. Additionally, carryover funds from the lead jurisdiction are currently being used to fund rural water supply firefighting equipment and appliances to standardize rural water supply operations by the four KQ County volunteer fire departments, and the secondary jurisdiction has no carryover funds available.

Impact on Training: Please provide a description of the impact not receiving the funding will have on your locality.
 King and Queen and Middlesex Counties do not have sufficient resources to conduct fire suppression/attack and search and rescue training. This insufficiency leads to the failure to provide for the safety of both citizens and firefighters. Both counties are constrained by NFPA 1403, Live Fire Training requirements, including the required number of instructors, personnel, equipment, time, and coordination involved. Failing to receive the requested funding, fully or in part, will reduce the fire departments' ability to conduct regular fire attack/ suppression training and will also prevent firefighters from receive sufficient and realistic search and rescue training. Note: This request is a continuation of the grant received in 2023 and adds additional components of the Lion Attack Digital Fire Training "Panel Plus" system, not requested/funded in 2023.



Funding, Maintenance, and Use of Digital Fire Attack Hoses/Nozzles,
Search and Rescue Mannequins, and Accessory Fire Training Equipment**

- King and Queen County and Middlesex County are both excited to apply for the VDFP Regional Fire Service Training Facility (RFSTF) Grant and believe that the requested funds for training simulation equipment will be crucial in providing realistic fire suppression and search and rescue training for our firefighters from nine separate departments.
- Each county is committed to increase the utilization of available training locations, including the VDFP Middle Peninsula Burn Building to leverage existing resources as locations to maximize equipment use.
- Each county supports the proposed RFSTF grant and financially commits to an equal share of the of the remaining unfunded portion of approximately \$15,497.99 or \$7,748.99 each with a 50/50 split.



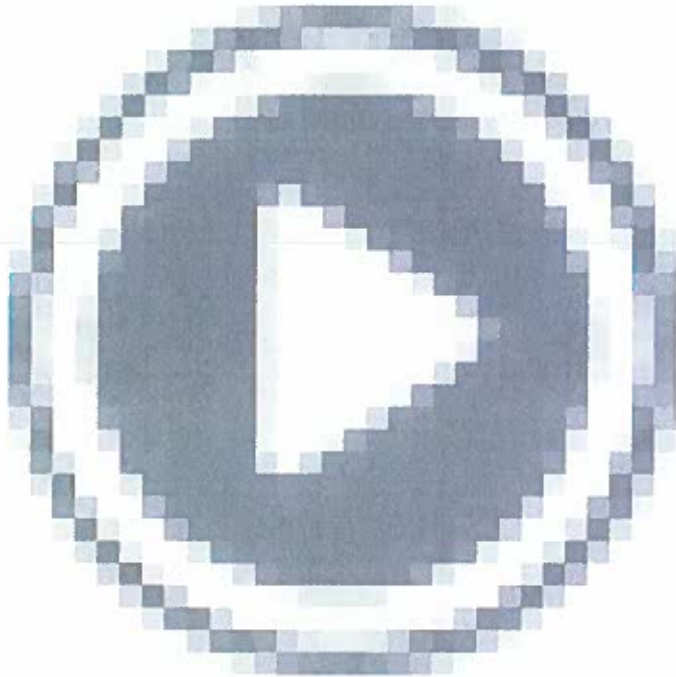

Financial Need: Please provide a description of your locality's funding need.

The Town of Blackstone is requesting \$48,906.00 in grant funds to purchase a 200 lbs. propane cylinder fire simulator prop. and portable fire unit (system 64). In the past two years, over twenty (20) agencies have utilized the Blackstone Training facility to provide Firefighter I and II training, vehicle extrication training, recruit schools, and an advanced truck school. The building was designed and created through a commission of three counties. This commission has dissolved and has left the maintenance and financial responsibility of the building to the Town of Blackstone. The Town has limited financial capacity to contribute to the facility due to other obligations. The Town also financially supports the Blackstone Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD). The BVFD just recently closed out a USDA Rural development grant/loan to purchase an approximately a 1.7-million-dollar aerial truck known as Tower 6. The Town received approximately \$980,000 in grant funding to purchase this truck. The remaining funding was taken out as a loan. The Town is currently paying \$3400.12 monthly for 15-years at an 2.25% interest rate. The Tower 6 grant has been closed out with USDA Rural Development. The Town also purchased an additional Engine in 2022. The Town took out a \$275,000 loan and is currently paying \$2547 a month for 10 years at a 2.25% interest rate. The total of these two loans is \$5,947.12 a month. With the expense to purchase these vehicles and rising costs, Blackstone does not have the budget to contribute an additional \$48,906.00 to purchase propane fire props for the training facility. The partner localities are committed to provide local funding to supplement a Burn Building grant request and cannot provide funds for the propane fire simulator.

Impact on Training: Please provide a description of the impact not receiving the funding will have on your locality.

Currently the training facility does not have a propane fire simulator. For training purposes, the departments are currently using an old car that they set on fire to practice. This can be time intensive and each car can only be burned one time. Also, this will provide a regional training facility for approximately 20 departments. Currently the closest propane fire prop is in Chesterfield, which is a 1 hour drive away from the facility and even further for other members of the region. By purchasing a propane fire prop, this can allow for local and regional training opportunities. This will also allow for instructors to control the training environment teaching trainees a variety of propane fire situations. With these props, the facility will also allow the facility to be used more often and increase visibility of the facility. Without this grant, the Town nor partner County will not be able to purchase these props, therefore will leave the department to either travel long distances to access this equipment or not train at all on propane fires. This results in logistically challenging training exercises or no live propane fire training at all, making local fire departments ill prepared for certain fire situations.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Between Town of Blackstone, Virginia & Nottoway County, Virginia

I. INTRODUCTION

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) ("Memorandum"), dated **August 26, 2024** between THE TOWN OF BLACKSTONE ("PARTNER A"), a locality established under the laws of the United States of America with its office at 100 W. Elm Street Blackstone, Virginia represented by Philip Vannoorbeeck, Town Manager; and NOTTOWAY COUNTY ("PARTNER B"), a Virginia, USA County with its principal place of business at 344 W. Courthouse Road, Crewe, VA 23930, represented by Stephen Bowen, County Administrator; collectively referred to as "THE PARTNERS."

WHEREAS, THE PARTNERS wish to work together and in compliance with the following clause(s):

II. GOAL

WHEREAS, The Partners express their intent to form a general partnership ("THE PARTNERSHIP") under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, with the understanding that the terms of the Partnership Agreement are subject to negotiation. Financial Need: Please provide a description of your locality's funding need.
 During the previous two years, the Town of Chilhowie and Smyth County jointly invested over \$825,000.00 in ARPA funding in the Fire Training Center to construct a classroom building, purchase some loose equipment, and pave the site. This one-time investment allowed us to make significant improvements, but these funds have now been expended. We currently operate the facility with a very limited budget that covers only the operational expenses such as electricity, telephone service, cleaning supplies, fire alarm monitoring, and the annual engineering inspection services for the live fire building. We do not have a capital budget to add props to the facility. We do actively seek out additional assistance to expand the facility including donated items, other grants, and business partnerships.

Impact on Training: Please provide a description of the impact not receiving the funding will have on your locality.
 This facility provides all of the basic firefighter training for two career, one combination, and five volunteer agencies in Smyth County. Additionally, the site serves as a regional training and testing center for most of the Mt. Rogers Planning District fire departments. Currently, there are two basic fire academies taught each year which include Firefighter I, Hazardous Materials Operations, and Firefighter II. Each of these classes are paid for by Smyth County (the instructional labor is donated, and the only expenses are for disposables) with only the expense of testing provided by the Department of Fire Programs. This facility is also used by local, state, and federal partners for more advanced training programs. Realistic forcible entry training is an essential part of basic firefighter training. Currently, the only forcible entry door prop available at the training center is the PowerJamb door on the live fire building which offers very limited training opportunities. This prop has caused some damage to the door frame on the live fire building and its use has now been discontinued.



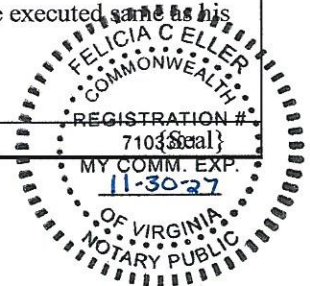

In an effort to better utilize the training facility that we have at the Virginia Public Safety Training Center (VPSTC), we are adding training props as we have funding available. This year we have funding for an affordable drill towers rope rescue training prop. The cost of the purchase and erection of the prop is approximately \$160,000.00, that the agency has funding for. However, the training prop must be erected on a concrete slab, which is the part of the project for which we are requesting funding. The cost range for the slab needed for this project is between \$35,000.00 - \$50,000.00.



1. PURPOSE and AUTHORITY

This policy document describes the practices by which the Virginia Department of Fire Programs (VDFP or the Agency) executes the administration and expenditure of allotments from the Fire Programs Fund (Fund) established in *Code of Virginia* (the Code) [§ 38.2-401](#). The Fund is derived from an annual assessment against all licensed insurance companies doing business in the Commonwealth writing a Code-defined type of insurance. The Fund is used to provide an annual population-based allocation to qualifying jurisdictions within the Commonwealth collected by the State Corporation Commission. These funds are transferred during June. As provided in the Code and described in this Policy, the allocation may only be used for fire service purposes and may not supplant or replace locally appropriated funds.

2. DEFINITION OF TERMS

“Aid to Localities (ATL)” means the annual allocation to jurisdictions in the Commonwealth authorized by *Code of Virginia* [§ 38.2-401](#).

“Annual Report” means the document that jurisdictions are required to submit to VDFP which reports on the use of the funds allocated to the jurisdiction for the previous year. Jurisdictions also provide one completed Fire Programs Fund Disbursement Agreement forms in accordance with Code of Virginia [§ 38.2-401.B](#).

“Eligible Jurisdiction” means each independent city, county, and town incorporated within a county, as listed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth in the Annual Report.¹

“Eligible Use of ATL Funds” means use of ATL Funds as described in the *Code of Virginia* [§ 38.2-401](#) and clarified in this Policy.

- ATL Funds allocated to the jurisdictions shall be used solely for the purposes of;
 - Training volunteer or career firefighting personnel in each of the receiving localities.
 - Funding fire prevention and public safety education programs.
 - Constructing, improving and expanding regional or local fire service training facilities.
 - Purchasing emergency medical care and equipment for fire personnel.
 - Payment of personnel costs related to fire and medical training for fire personnel;
 - or
 - For purchasing personal protective equipment, vehicles, equipment and supplies for use in the receiving locality specifically for fire service purposes.
 - Diesel exhaust removal systems, decontamination equipment, and commercial extractors, that are designed to reduce the incidence of cancer among firefighters.

ATL Funds allocated to the jurisdictions shall **not be** used directly or indirectly to supplant or replace any other funds appropriated by the counties, cities and towns for fire service operations.

“Fiscal Period” means the Commonwealth’s fiscal period which begins on July 1st and runs through June 30th of the next calendar year, *e.g.*, July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023 is FY23.

¹ In this Policy, “Jurisdiction” is sometimes used interchangeably with “Locality.”

“**Reporting Period**” means the 12-month period that is documented in the jurisdiction’s annual report.

3. PRECEDENCE OF LAW & DISCLAIMER

Nothing contained within this document shall be construed to supersede the *Code of Virginia*. In the event of a conflict, the *Code of Virginia* shall supersede the conflicting provision of this Policy document.

4. REPORTING

Section [§ 38.2-401.B](#) requires jurisdictions to satisfactorily complete and submit timely two (2) documents to VDFP annually before the jurisdiction is eligible for the ATL allocation:

- A. An Annual Report in which they must report to the Agency on the prior year’s ATL usage:**
- Cash carry forward from previous funding years (if applicable).
 - Current ATL funding for the year being reported.
 - Qualifying expenditures for the current funding year being reported.
 - Cash carry forward balance into future reporting years (if applicable).
 - Tentative spend plan for carry forward balances (if applicable).
- B. A complete Disbursement Agreement form as prescribed by the Virginia Fire Services Board as located on the VDFP website.**

If, at the end of any annual reporting period, the eligible jurisdiction has not submitted to VDFP a satisfactory Annual Report and one complete Disbursement Agreement form, any ATL funds due to that locality for the next year shall not be allocated to the locality. The allocation shall be retained in the Fund.

Beginning with the FY2015 funding year, accounting documentation (such as General Ledger reports, bank statements, or detailed spreadsheets) must be maintained by the jurisdiction for audit purposes.

- 5. FORFEITURE:** Jurisdictions that fail to submit annual documents shall forfeit the allocated amount. Such amount is retained in the Fund for distribution to localities in the next allocation cycle. Funds are made available on July 1 of the current fiscal year funding cycle and are available for collection by the locality until June 30 of the same fiscal year.

Example: For example, funds made available July 1, 2022, for the FY2023 funding cycle will be available for collection by the jurisdictions until June 30, 2023.

6. DISBURSEMENTS FROM THE FUND

1. Jurisdictions Eligible for ATL –Eligibility is restricted to jurisdictions within the Commonwealth of Virginia as provided in Code of Virginia [38.2-401.B](#). Fire Departments

or fire service organizations are **not eligible** to directly receive ATL funds from the Agency.

2. ATL Allocation period Defined – Funds received each June 30 from SCC are used for ATL in the fiscal period beginning July 1st.
3. Minimum Allocations – Section [§ 38.2-401.B](#) specifies that minimum allocations for Counties, Cities, and Towns must be based on population as provided for in Code [§ 4.1-116](#) and [4.1-117](#). If the calculations of a jurisdiction’s population-based allocation are below the statutory minimum, then the jurisdiction’s allocation is increased to the statutory minimum for the fiscal period in question.
4. Authorized Use of ATL – Pursuant to [38.2-401.B](#) of the Code, ATL funds shall be used to construct, improve or expand fire service training facilities, fire-related training provided at such training facilities shall be by instructors certified or approved according to policies developed by the Virginia Fire Services Board.
5. Distribution Calculation –As provided in [38.2-401.B](#), distributions from the Fund shall be made on the basis of population; however, no eligible county or city shall receive less than \$10,000, nor eligible town less than \$4,000. The Virginia Fire Services Board shall be authorized to exceed allocations of \$10,000 for eligible counties and cities and \$4,000 for eligible towns, respectively. Any increases or decreases in such allocations shall be uniform for all localities.
6. Annual Report Categorical Descriptions - The following items expand upon the allowable uses of ATL funds by category as listed on the ATL Annual Report Document.

Category 1 (C1) - Training of Fire Services personnel NOT reported in [C6] –

(a) Training expenses such as registration fees and all travel costs associated with attendance and participation in support of the fire services at educational opportunities held within and outside Virginia. Examples include, but are not limited to conference registration/tuition, lodging, mileage, and meals while traveling to the fire services training. Examples also include but are not limited to support of health and safety initiatives for fire service personnel in compliance with the NFPA Standards. (b) Personnel cost to establish new training positions within the fire services training division. Example includes salary expenses for permanent, temporary, contract, part-time and full-time fire training personnel.

C2 –Public Fire Safety Education Programs – Cost of fire services personnel to provide fire prevention and public safety educational programs. Examples include, but are not limited posters, advertisements, and salary expenses for permanent, temporary, contract, part-time and full-time workers.

C3 – Local Fire Service training facilities as such principally or solely serves the locality – Cost to construct, improve or expand fire service training facilities and fire-related training props/aids and equipment storage provided at such training facilities. Examples include but are not limited to the construction of burn buildings, flammable liquid pits, mazes, props for hazardous materials and heavy technical rescue, and classroom space.

C4 – Fire Service training facilities including those that are Regional/multi-jurisdictional – Cost of constructing, improving and expanding regional or local fire service training facilities and equipment storage. Examples include but are not limited to the construction of burn buildings, flammable liquid pits, mazes, props for hazardous materials and heavy technical rescue, and classroom space.

C5 - Emergency medical care and equipment for Fire Personnel – Equipment and care used solely for fire personnel who are first responders in the direct commission of firefighting or fire suppression and are in need of emergency medical care. Examples include but are not limited AED machines and first aid kits to be used solely for the emergency care of fire personnel.

C6 - Payment of personnel costs related to fire and medical training for fire personnel NOT reported in [C1] – Payroll expenses to cover the direct fire service operations while the fire services personnel are attending the fire or medical training for fire personnel. An example includes backfilling the usual fire services personnel shift with a second shift of direct firefighting personnel to work while the usual shift attends the training as described in C1.

C7 - Personal Protective Equipment for Fire Service Personnel – Personal protective equipment, breathing apparatus, equipment, and tools used to support operational needs. Examples include but are not limited to the purchase of or emergency/critical repair of items such as boots, SCBA, fire protective clothing including turnout gear, personal fire shelters used in wild land fire suppression.

C8 - Fire Services Vehicles - Vehicles used for fire services purposes. Examples include but are not limited to the purchase of fire engines, pumpers, ladder trucks, and fire boats where there is an established marine firefighting program.

Emergency/Critical Repairs: Emergency/critical repairs are eligible only when agency approval is obtained prior to expenditure. *Emergency/Critical Repairs are those repairs that allow inoperable equipment/ vehicles to meet its intended use. Routine maintenance and repairs are not included.*

C9 - Fire Services Equipment and Supplies - Equipment and supplies used to support and expand the support of fire services operations as well as to support the health and safety initiatives for fire service personnel in compliance with the NFPA Standards. Examples include but are not limited to the purchase or emergency/critical repairs for items such as hoses, ladders, and handheld and power tools used in the performance of fire services operations along with diesel exhaust removal systems, decontamination equipment, and commercial extractors designed to reduce the incidence of cancer among firefighters. *Emergency/Critical Repairs are those repairs that allow inoperable equipment/ vehicles to meet its intended use. Routine maintenance and repairs are not included.*

7. Non-Authorized Use - The following items are **not permitted** as an allowable use of ATL funds.
1. Sales Tax.
 2. Routine maintenance expenses.
 3. Medical equipment, supplies, and vehicles used for emergency or ambulatory medical treatment for non-firefighting personnel.



4. Compensation for lost wages due to class attendance or participation.
 5. Replacement of or to supplant locally appropriated funds.
8. Review Process - Inquiries regarding the use of ATL funds are to be sent to VDFP Budget and Grants Manager for review and consideration. VDFP will make an evaluation of the inquiry considering [§38.2-401](#) of the Code of Virginia and the most current ATL Policy. VDFP will provide a provisional decision to localities via certified e-mail. Review of ATL Denial Notice will be added as a standing item for the Administration, Policy and Finance Committee to enable localities denied use of funding to present their request for reconsideration.
- Localities shall provide a notice of review to VDFP’s Budget and Grants Manager within 30 calendar days from receipt of the e-mail correspondence. Failure to submit a notice of review will render VDFP’s provisional decision final. Upon receipt of a notice of review, VDFP will notify the locality of the next scheduled Administration, Policy and Finance Committee and/or VFSB meeting, encouraging the locality to be present to discuss its review request. If the next VFSB meeting occurs in less than seven (7) business days, the review will be scheduled for the following VFSB meeting.

Tracking Database: The Agency maintains tracking database to capture all denials by fiscal year. The denials tracking database will be provided to the Virginia Fire Services Board at the conclusion of each fiscal year.

9. “Carry-forward” of ATL by Jurisdictions – Jurisdictions may ‘carry-forward’ ATL funds. Any such balances carried-forward shall be accounted for by the jurisdiction in its mandated Annual Report.

Dear Ms. Johnston:

I am writing this letter of financial hardship in an effort to obtain 100% funding for the Blackstone Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD) and the Town of Blackstone's grant application for a propane fire training prop.

The Blackstone Volunteer Fire Department is an all-volunteer Fire and EMS department located in the Town of Blackstone and Nottoway County, Virginia. The population of Nottoway County is 15,642 and the total area is 316 square miles. Nottoway County is located in rural Southside Virginia with a median income of only \$27,223 per person. 19.1% Nottoway residents live below the poverty level compared with 10.2% for the Commonwealth. This ranks Nottoway as number 116 out of 132 localities in Virginia.

The BVFD receives financial support through the Commonwealth of Virginia, Nottoway County, and the Town of Blackstone. This money is "pass through" funding and is reflected in the Town budget.

The BVFD also conducts fundraising in order to supplement the Town's contribution. These events include a golf tournament, boot drive, selling food at various events, and a letter fund drive.


Blackstone currently has two pieces of fire apparatus being financed with a total monthly payment of \$5947.12 per month and a principal balance of almost \$795,000.

The Town of Blackstone is currently working on another VDFP grant application to make repairs to our burn building.

We understand that there is a cost share on that program as well. We cannot afford to pay the cost share for both the propane prop and the burn building. We have set aside money for the cost share on the burn building, but have no excess funds for this project.

Thank you for your time and consideration. We look forward to a favorable reply.

Policy on Award Amount

The maximum amount of any project award shall not exceed \$50,000 per fiscal year funding cycle (July 1 – June 30). A locality may submit one application containing multiple training props but is only allowed to receive a maximum award of \$50,000.

Policy on Funding Criteria

A locality submitting a standard application is eligible to receive up to 50% of the proposed project. The locality is expected to contribute the remaining 50%. Funding may be considered using an 80/20 formula if a hardship can be shown and justification is included. A request for a 100% funding formula will be considered in an extreme hardship situation and must be adequately justified. Total funding will only be considered in exceptional circumstances.
